## Third Chance Program Keeps Rollin' Along

Pet Project Foundation's participation in giving hundreds of dogs a third chance is one of its most noteworthy accomplishments. These dogs may have been denied a chance to make it into new loving homes without the help of PPF and the San Clemente–Dana Point Animal Shelter. As kennel space becomes available, staff members from the shelter travel to overcrowded shelters and select dogs to bring back to the shelter. These 3rd Chance dogs are typically adopted quickly, averaging a stay at the shelter of less than 2 weeks. As of

mid-April, there have been over 300 dogs brought-in under the 3rd Chance program since the program began in September, 2005. Your financial contributions to PPF help us pay for the veterinary care, medication, a professional dog trainer, spay/neuter surgeries, kennel attendants, a registered veterinary technician, food, treats, toys, and bedding for these dogs. Take comfort in knowing that some homeless dogs outside of our local community are being saved, and cared for, and are making it into new, "forever" homes.

Buddy came with warnings from the shelter. We needed to understand that he reacted a little differently to things than one normally expected from a dog. We drove over 100 miles to see him. He was named Blair at that time, after the towing service that brought him into the shelter. We brought along the dog who would be his buddy, to be sure they would get along, and they were fine.

After being home with us, Buddy chose his own name upon hearing it one day. I'm sure it was his old name by the way he reacted to it. Even after one year away from his original home he remembered his name. And so the story goes on...he is the most well mannered of dogs we have ever had, and one of the best. All dogs will be special and nothing will take away that special sentiment in the heart from a lost pet. But, life goes on and there are many dogs that need homes. Each dog comes with his or her own personality, and will find a way into your heart in his or her own right, and definitely in his or her own way.



Buddy enjoys traveling in the car, being around the water, loves to great people and shake hands (ambidextrously), but mostly loves to be brushed. Bath, they're okay too. Pictured is Sammy. This little guy was freshly shaved at the Riverside Shelter. He was in a cage with 4 other dogs as I walked by with our trainer Denise Sboth. A basset hound approximately twice Sammy's size started to attack him violently. We banged on the locked cage trying to deter the attack, but the basset hound continued. It finally stopped and we were able to get a staff member to unlock the cage. We looked him over and did not see open wounds, except for what appeared to be a rash on his bottom area. We thought it was from shaving. We took him to our shelter and then to one of our local veterinarians. The veterinarian suspected the rashes were abrasions from being tossed around in the cage. They became increasingly infected over time. Sammy is now healing and looking good!
